What are my duties as the Hall Council President?

- To attend weekly meeting of the Student Advisory Committee (SAC; but only if you are the University Hall President as you are seen at the Freshman Class' representative.)

Do I have any more duties than the list above?

Those are your constitutional duties as you, and the rest of your board, have implied duties upon certain events, changes, and activities throughout the course of the year. It is also your job to oversee the rest of the Executive Board and to make sure that everyone is on task with their delegated responsibilities. This will give you a better idea of what other Hall Councils are doing and how their leadership is different.
