What are my duties as Vice-President?

Your duties are few, but pertinent to the Hall Council system:

- To take over the role of President in case of absence.
- To maintain open lines of communication throughout the Residence Hall floors.
- To be responsible for putting together a recognition or award system for the residents in your hall.
- To vote.

What do you mean “maintain open lines of communication?”

It is up to your discretion to organize a system of Floor Senators in order to spread the word regarding General Assembly themes and activities or Hall Council events. If you decide to do this, then you will have a separate meeting time and location, since the Floor Senators cannot attend Hall Council Exec., and share information with them. We recommend there is no more than one Floor Senator on each respective floor.

What is this award system you speak of?

You can recognize residents for their contribution to either Hall Council or ARH, but we recommend you aide the Of the Month (OTM) award system put on by our Illinois Communications Coordinators.
